My name is Dale Shick and for those who don't know me, I currently serve as Camp Promotion Advisor for both the Seneca Chapter and the Lodge.

Camp promotions is the duty of every Arrowman. In 1948 the Order of the Arrow became an official part of the national camping program for the Boy Scouts of America. The OA became known as the Boy Scout's brotherhood of honor campers. Our purpose became as follows:

- To recognize those Scouts and Scouters who best exemplify the Scout Oath and Law in their daily lives
- 2. To develop and maintain camping traditions and spirit
- 3. To promote Scout camping
- 4. To make firm the Scout habit of helpfulness and cheerful service to others

How can you promote camping? Start by camping as much as you can with your

own Units. Be a brother to all. Help your fellow Scouts without being asked. Make their camping experiences as enjoyable and rewarding as possible. Make your fellow Scouts want to camp.

Another way to promote camping is to suggest to your Leaders to have a camp promotions meeting during the year. Each Chapter has a youth and adult responsible for conducting camp promotion programs. They are trained to discuss the Council camping programs, both long term and short term.

We have some great camps here in Council. Camp Schoelkopf, Camp Scouthaven, Camp Stonehaven are all camps that we can be proud of. We as Arrowman need to promote camping and to promote our camps to our fellow Scouts and those Scouts we meet on the trail. 
