Evolving from a "Sash and Dash" Troop into a 2013 OA Unit of Excellence

This February Troop 457 had the honor of receiving the 2013 OA Unit of Excellence Award. The award was presented at a troop Court of Honor by Lodge Adviser Jamie Prowse. Unlike the other troop that received it, we have only been actively involved in the lodge for the past few years. Prior to that, we were referred to as a "sash and dash troop". What changed? We did!

Looking back at 2010, other than 2 ordeal weekends, no one from our troop attended a single OA event. Fast forward to 2013 - we had someone from our troop at every major lodge event. 3 scouts were members of the LEC; attended LLD and OA National Leadership Seminar (NLS) in Alpine, NJ: and completed their NLS ticket. We had a broomball team for the first time (which we did again in 2014). Now we have 14 ordeal candidates looking forward to their ordeal this spring and at least 14 troop members going to the 2014 conclave.

How did we do this? First we started talking up the OA way before the annual election while we were at summer camp. Then our OA troop representatives actually went to LEC and chapter meetings - failure to do so meant no leadership credit as our troop needed them to do their job. The adult leadership encouraged them and backed their efforts. One Assistant Scoutmaster served as the OA troop representative adviser. It took a while, but it worked. They promoted events and went to them. They made sure all our scouts knew what the OA is, what the OA does and the fun they were having. Accomplishments by troop OA members were communicated to the troop as a whole – from being elected as a candidate, providing service at an ordeal weekend, to attending the OA National Leadership Seminar - the troop was kept informed.

Our troop representatives, now our lodge chief elect Noah Gould and lodge vice chief of program elect Anthony Rinaldo lead by example in motivating our troop. Their success was evident at our Court of Honor this February when there were almost as many wearing OA sashes as there were wearing Merit Badge sashes. Their efforts resulted in Noah and Anthony earning the OA Unit of Excellence patch for their work as OA Troop Representatives. I received the OA Unit of Excellence patch as well for my role as their OA Troop Representative Adviser and our scoutmaster received a certificate. Beyond the patches and a certificate, what our troop really received was a number of scouts who have brought their experiences in the OA back to our troop. Whether they went to Summit Corps in 2011, Conclave 2012, OA Bowling 2013, Broomball 2014, or are on the LEC; those active in the OA have become more active in our troop and in scouting. They are setting an example of leadership and service for others for all members of our troop and are encouraging them to do the same.

I challenge each Senior Patrol Leader to name an OA Troop Representative and each Scoutmaster to name an adviser for that representative. Then do the same in your troop.
