Bridger Teton National Forest

One thousand Arrowmen will descend upon Jackson, Wyoming for one week, beginning July 26, 2008, as the Order of the Arrow undertakes its largest service opportunity in Scouting history: *ArrowCorps*⁵.

ArrowCorps⁵ is a once in a lifetime program. The event is the largest volunteer service effort ever undertaken by the Boy Scouts of America. A Scout's duty to country calls us all to help preserve the beauty of treasures like national forests.

Though there are five sites available for attendance, our council has chosen to send a contingent to Bridger-Teton National Forest. The U.S. Forest Service has set aside some of the highest priority

projects in the most beautiful landscapes in America.

Located in western Wyoming adjacent to the Yellowstone and Grand Teton National Parks, the Bridger-Teton is one of the largest forests in the United States covering 3.4 million acres. Participants will construct mountain bike and hiking trails, remove fencing to allow unrestricted movement of wildlife, and help control fire through a fuels reduction project where the forest and urban areas meet.

The project will provide a much larger area and open range for wildlife, such as elk, moose, antelope, mule deer, bear, and wolf. The open range is especially

important for these animals during the winter months when food is scarce. In addition, the larger available area will improve breeding, birthing, grazing, and it will reduce the transmission of disease. Clearly, this meaningful project will benefit many native flora and fauna for years to come.

As many of you have heard by now at the request of the Supreme Chief of the Fire, I have accepted an appointment as advisor to the lodge. Let me begin by stating that it is with the greatest appreciation that I thank the past advisor Roger Lemke for his faithful and committed service in the past. As well as extend my deepest thanks to him in his willingness to continue to serve in the capacity of Associate Advisor for Administration. I know that this will ensure the continued growth and success of the lodge. During the transition period a great many of you have extended your congratulations and words of willingness to serve. I cannot begin to express how much these words have meant to me as I accept the challenge of advising the chief and the lodge. I view each of you as an asset to the lodge and look forward to serving with you. During discussion with the Key 3 of the lodge and developing a plan of action for the remained of the year the following tasks have come to light as being of con-

- **Ouality Lodge Attainment-The** 1. largest factor still under concern is the appropriate percentage of brotherhood conversion. The target for this year is the conversion of 120 ordeal members to reach the percentage; as of this date we have attained only one-half of that number who have converted. I wish to remind each of you that when you completed your ordeal you began a journey to brotherhood during the next ten to twelve months, as you became more understanding of the principals of our order. Brotherhood conversion is a primary indicator as to the health of the lodge and allows us to compete for funding to support our council camping programs. No conversions, no quality, no source of funding. I call upon each of you to strongly consider attending the fall service weekend if only to seal your membership in brotherhood.
- 2. Annual Recharter-once again the season is upon us to review the membership of the lodge as we prepare to recharter with national. If at all possible please send in your dues at the earliest possible

- convenience, your timeliness in this matter allows the lodge to continue its good standing and work.
- 3. Lodge Strategic Plan-as an outcome of the recent National Lodge Conservation and Leadership meeting each lodge is required to develop a new five year plan that is aligned with the national Order of the Arrow and local council strategic plans and submit the same to both the council executive and the national office in what will be less than sixty days. A major undertaking for the chief and LEC.

I am convinced that if we all work to accomplish the areas above that we will meet with success. My encouragement to the membership is lets go for it, make it happen, and lets celebrate. We are the brotherhood of honor campers!
