This approach has been quite a learning curve for me personally in lodge leadership, as I have previously stated I cannot thank each of you for your input, support and tolerance with the many steps of this journey. To date we are off to a decent start for the New Year, we have been rechartered with the national office and may continue to do our great work. It is unfortunate that we did not make quality lodge in 2007 due to three major items: 1) failure to achieve positive growth, mainly the result of an internal audit during transition to Lodge master, the approved/endorsed membership management tool, and removal of a good number of members who were one or more years in arrears for dues, if you have been

dropped from the roles and desire reinstatement, or have not received a dues renewal letter from the lodge please contact the lodge at info@oalodge159.org to identify the possible situation and begin the reinstatement process. Lodge leadership is actively doing elections at this time to ensure inductions. While dealing with elections they are also trying to track down members who have not paid dues for 2008. Please assist them by paying your dues ASAP. 2) Failure to achieve brotherhood conversion rate of at least 30% of eligible members. If you have been an ordeal member for at least ten months, you are eligible. Please consider converting to brotherhood at the earliest time and date. We each began a process of growth as servant leaders at our ordeal a process that should lead to brotherhood. 3) Failure to conduct a Lodge Leadership Development Course: the next one will be held in the April time frame and is strongly encouraged for all lodge leadership, and open to all members. Especially, those who may desire to lead within their chapter or the lodge in general, we can always use more youth involvement in leadership, and it is your lodge. Looking toward the future I look forward to seeing many of you at the lodge dinner, the Section Conclave, the spring service weekends, and at camp this summer.
