Brothers,

A great way to promote the Order of the Arrow (OA) in your units is to make sure that each and every new Ordeal and Brotherhood member gets recognized at the time of their ordeal or brotherhood ceremony. This should be done by the OA Rep at the troop meeting immediately following the ceremony.

If your troop uses e-mail or Facebook, post it! It is amazing what a little bit of publicity can do. Also, the sense of pride that newer members will have to see their name and a picture in a troop-wide announcement. Combine it with noting the service they have performed and people will notice. If nothing else it may cause a few people to ask what the OA is and give you an opportunity to talk about OA.
